

# Key Findings

# 2006 Part II

- A majority of American high school students say they're plugged into mainstream news on the Internet at least weekly. Eleven percent say they consume news daily on the Internet.
- 2. Students who go online get most of their news and information from the news pages of Internet portals such as Google and Yahoo!, national TV news sites and local daily newspaper web sites. Weblogs came in fourth place.
- 3. Most high school students find TV and newspapers to be the most accurate news sources. They don't trust the accuracy of weblogs.
- 4. Despite their reliance on traditional news sources, nearly half say they also get news and information from entertainment programs at least once a week.



A majority of American high school students say they're plugged into mainstream news on the Internet at least weekly. Eleven percent say they consume news daily on the Internet.

## "How often, if at all, do you get news and information from online or Internet sources in general?"



Use of the Internet for news is in part driven by the online access that most students have at home and at school. More than half of American high school students now get news online at least once a week. Fully 97 percent of students say they have access to the Internet at school, and 87 percent say they have access at home.



Many high school students are also using the Internet to communicate with others through email, online discussions and weblogs. Seventy-one percent of American high school students report sending and receiving e-mails at least once a week (30 percent say they e-mail every day); 44 percent participate in online discussions and/or chat groups at least once a week (18 percent every day); and 31 percent report posting messages or opinions to online columns (i.e. weblogs) at least weekly (10 percent daily).


"How often, if at all, do you use the Internet, the World Wide Web or an online service to . . . "



Students who go online get most of their news and information from the news pages of Internet portals such as Google and Yahoo!, national TV news sites and local daily newspaper web sites. Weblogs came in fourth place.

Among those who use the Internet, 66 percent get news and information at least once a week from Internet portals such as Google, Microsoft, Yahoo! and AOL; 32 percent get news and information at least once per week from weblogs; 45 percent from network TV news web sites; 34 percent from local TV or newspaper web sites; and 21 percent from national newspaper web sites.


Student online users who use each of the following at least once a week to get news and information:



Most high school students find TV and newspapers to be the most accurate news sources. They don't trust the accuracy of weblogs (also called "blogs").


"Which of these media sources do you consider ...?"

More students regard TV (45 percent) as the overall best source of news, followed by newspapers (23 percent), Internet publications other than weblogs (10 percent), and radio (9 percent). High school teachers, on the other hand, say newspapers (48 percent) are the best news source, followed by TV (28 percent), Internet publications other than blogs (15 percent) and radio (5 percent). Students also see TV as the most accurate source of news and the easiest to use.

"Which of these media sources do you consider the best overall source of news?"



#### **SUMMARY OF METHODOLOGY**

The overall design for conducting this project featured a multi-stage cluster sampling methodology. Employing this technique produced a scientific, and thus generalizable, survey of high school students and teachers in the United States. This technique involved drawing an initial sample of 45 high school buildings in the United States.

For each of these 45 schools, a phone call was placed to the school principal, asking if his/her school would be willing to participate in the project. Thirty-four principals agreed to have their schools participate in the survey.

These 34 school administrators were asked to coordinate the administration of surveys to all students and teachers in the school building. Principals themselves were also asked to complete a survey. Copies of the student and teacher surveys may be found in the appendix to this report.

In total, 14,498 students and 882 teachers completed the questionnaires.

This project was designed and conducted by Dr. David Yalof and Dr. Kenneth Dautrich.
